#### **About us**

Baylor Black Sea Foundation is part of Baylor International Pediatric AIDS Initiative (BIPAI) at Texas Children's Hospital in Houston, Texas. The mission of BIPAI is to provide high-quality, high-impact, highly ethical pediatric and family-centered health care, health professional training and clinical research, focused in HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis, malaria, malnutrition and other conditions impacting the health and well-being of children and families worldwide.

The Center of Excellence or the Romanian-American Children's Center was opened on April 6th, 2001, and the Baylor Black Sea Foundation was established in 2004. The Center was founded by Dr. Mark Kline, who wished to help the children infected with HIV that he met during his first visit to Romania in the

late '90s. The Center became the largest pediatric clinic in Europe for care and treatment of HIV. Baylor Romania is part of a network of centers with headquarters in Houston, Texas, USA created by Baylor College of Medicine and Texas Children's Hospital. The network includes 14 countries in Africa, North America, South America and Eastern Europe. Today, the Baylor Foundation has an extended mission in preventing, treating and caring for patients with infectious diseases. Baylor operates a Center of Excellence in Constanta, three rapid testing and counseling offices in the Dobrogea area (the first ones in Romania), a mobile lab and a housing complex for vulnerable youth. BIPAI Romania works to minimize the impact of infectious diseases such as HIV/AIDS, hepatitis, tuberculosis and sexually transmitted diseases.





#### **BIPAI** network

BIPAI operates in 14 countries, providing pediatric medical care, professional education for health professionals and research into pediatric health. Below are listed the primary health conditions that BIAPAI focuses on in each country.

- 1. Angola: Sickle Cell Anemia
- 2. Botswana: tuberculosis, hematology & oncology, HIV/AIDS, emergency medicine
- 3. Colombia: Malnutrition, pediatrics, OB/GYN
- 4. Lesotho: HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis
- 5. Liberia: Medical Education in Pediatrics and OB/GYN
- 6. Malawi: HIV/AIDS, malnutrition, tuberculosis, hematology & oncology, surgery & anesthesia, pediatric emergency medicine, OB/GYN

- 7. Morocco: Training in pediatric subspecialty care
- 8. Papua New Guinea: Medical education in pediatrics, OB/GYN, public health
- 9. România: Dentistry, tuberculosis, hepatitis B&C, HIV/AIDS
- 10. Swaziland: HIV/AIDS, TB, maternal care
- 11. Tanzania: HIV/AIDS, TB, palliative care, malnutrition, hematology & oncology
- 12. Uganda: TB, HIV/AIDS, OB/GYN, hematology & oncology
- 13. Argentina: Maternal health
- 14. Texas Children's Hospital USA Headquarters

The Baylor Center of Excellence, opened in 2001 for approximately 500 children suffering of HIV/AIDS, was a modern and suitable space for the needs of that time.

The patients aging and the expansion of services for those infected were important growth milestones. In addition, the Center started to offer services for viral hepatitis, meaning that an additional 1500 persons became our patients every year. Hundreds of medical professionals continue to participate in the courses offered by the Foundation. I emphasize these situations in order to highlight the fact that the Center became too small.

Membership in the BIPAI network, together with the standards of care to which we adhere, led to the initiation of this building expansion project. The AbbVie Foundation understood the importance of funding that directly responds to the present needs of patients and community.

Building another floor to the Center and modernizing the existing floors represent another materialization of the promise made 20 years ago by Dr. Mark Kline, president of BIPAI, to our city: providing the Romanian patients, in their country, services comparable to those they would receive in Houston.

In the coming years, the Center aims to:

- Prevent the spread of infectious diseases in our community, through initiatives that combine education, good practices and screening
- Reduce the physical, psychological and social impact of these infections, and
- Increase the abilities of patients and families affected by these diseases to self-manage through evidence-based behavioral change interventions

I would like to express my gratitude to the patients and employees of the Center that, during the expansion and remodeling work, have proven patience and adaptability. My colleagues helped with setting up and cleaning the Clinic, just as they would have done it for their own homes. This new Center offers respect to our patients and motivates the staff to work with dedication and passion. It also demonstrates that public-private partnerships and international collaborations represent a solution in order to improve the Romanian health system.

#### 2016: Facts and figures

#### A Step Forward for Baylor Romania

During 2016, the Baylor Center of Excellence's expansion and remodeling work was finalized. Inaugurated in 2001, the Center now receives its patients in a modern, clean and well equipped space, a model for the Romanian health care system. The building in which Baylor Romania and the Infectious Diseases Hospital are unfolding their activities has a new floor, modernized offices and allows for diversification of services delivered. This new step in the Baylor Center of Excellence's history, an investment of USD 346,000, would not have been possible and the unconditional support of AbbVie Foundation, Baylor College of Medicine and Texas Children's Hospital, and the contributions of donors and Romanian citizens that chose to give 2% of their income tax to the Baylor Black Sea Foundation.





#### Flower House, a new beginning



Not only was the Baylor Center of Excellence reconditioned, but the Residential Complex in Lazu, or Casa Florilor (Flowers House), also went through the reconditioning process. Repairing the building, painting the walls and replacing the furniture transformed the space where HIV-infected residents live.

Located only 2 km away from Constanta,

Casa Florilor was home to over 60

HIV-infected children and young people
throughout the years. Inhabitants of Casa
Florilor are counseled by psychologist
and "social mothers" and are helped
to take steps towards adulthood with
improved self-management skills, such
as management of financial resources or
taking care of the household on their own.



# Multi-million dollars help for the public healthcare system

Medication donations continue to help patients all over the country.
In 2016, with the support of
AmeriCares Foundation, over 10,000 patients in the public healthcare system benefitted from medicines donated by Baylor. The Infectious
Diseases Hospital in Constanta,
Emergency Clinical Hospital in Vaslui
County, Emergency Hospital Barlad,
Infectious Diseases Hospital Brasov,
Fundeni Clinical Institute, Elias
Emergency Hospital and Emergency
Hospital Petrosani benefitted from these donations.

During the past ten years, AmeriCares donated medicines valued at nearly \$65 million to the Romanian healthcare system, through Baylor Romania.

In 2016, partner hospitals received antiretrovirals, vitamins, antibiotics, anticonvulsants, analgesics, antidiarrheals; and cardiovascular, respiratory and dermatologic treatments.





#### Knowledge, the best ally against viruses

In 2016, Baylor Black Sea Foundation organized numerous campaigns and initiatives with the aim to inform the community about HIV and viral hepatitis transmission and prevention methods. In addition to this, Baylor remained a training center for doctors, nurses, psychologists, students and graduate students who participated in continuing education courses delivered at the Center of Excellence.







#### **Treatment for life**

The HIV Center has been providing care for patients and their families for over 16 years. The medical team works closely with the psychosocial department, and their common achievements are outstanding:

\* 77% of patients who initiated treatment had an adherence of >95% (considered optimal for anti-HIV treatment)

\* 49.5% of HIV-infected women treated at the Center accessed family planning services and 70.7% stated using a contraceptive method Out of 1,007 beneficiaries in the active medical care 88.48% are on antiretroviral treatment



# Community testing

Since its establishment nine years ago, the Voluntary Counseling and Testing (VCT) department has helped over 62.000 people to find their health status. Year after year, the number of those aware of the importance of HIV and hepatitis B&C testing has increased.

#### **European Testing Week**

Approximately 20% of Constanta City Hall employees were tested for HIV and viral hepatitis. The initiative unfolded during European Testing Week and was organized by the Baylor Black Sea Foundation in partnership with Constanta City Hall. Baylor teams tested 107 municipal employees. The conclusions from the week were that people are eager to be tested, but don't do it because of barriers such as lack of time, difficulties in leaving the workplace during the week or difficulties in obtaining a referral for free testing from their general practitioner. Baylor's project eliminated barriers, of time and place.


